## FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR



When Playwright Terry Guest was 15 years old, his beloved uncle sat him down and said. "I am gay and I have AIDS". Guest, who at that time had just begun to realize that he himself was gay, struggled with these revelations.

When his uncle died about a year after that conversation. Guest found himself shoved further in the closet, but he felt pulled to learn more about his uncle and honor him. Years later, in writing At the Wake of A Dead Drag Queen, Guest has created his own opportunity to explore his feelings, celebrate his uncle's life, and invite others to do the same.

This irreverent, hilarious, and moving new play thoughtfully uses storytelling, drama, and drag to celebrate life and love. It's a raucous, entertaining, and thought-provoking script that is equal parts drag show, comedy, and drama. We are thrilled to share this dynamic production with audiences.

We are also thrilled to launch Dobama's new "Full Circle Program" with this production. This new initiative connects audiences and artists with the communities represented onstage and the organizations that support them through audience engagement offerings. For Drag Queen, Dobama collaborated with local drag performers Onva Nurve and Veranda L'Ni as consultants on the show, helping to ensure the production was created with cultural competency. Onya was present in rehearsals and assisted on choreography, costume, and dramaturgy, and both queens advised on makeup.


Dobama also partnered with Near West Theatre and Veranda L'Ni offering the first Drag Story Hour at Dobama Theatre for area families. Additionally, to tie in the story's focus on the health disparities facing BIPOC LGBTQ+ people living with HIV, Dobama proudly partnered with the AIDS Taskforce of Greater Cleveland to provide free HIV testing, resources, and information to audiences including post-show discussions following dedicated performances throughout the run of the show.

PRESTON CROWDER (he/they), born and raised in Nashville, TN, is a playwright-actor-director-songwriter with a passion for telling stories surrounding the vast experiences of being Black and Queer in the United States. Preston's production history as a playwright includes BOCKING (The New Group, Staged Reading 2023), Don't Look Black (Tennessee Playwrights Studio, 2022), Worlds Melt (The New School of Drama, 2021), Break Your Chains (Juilliard School, 2017), and Flames (University School of Nashville, 2016). Preston's acting Credits include Pipeline (Xavier, Oberlin College), Is God Is (Scotch, The New School of Drama), Night Into Morning (Xavier, Short Film), Maidens (Figure 3,

Tennessee Playwrights Studio), *Sweat* (Chris, Humanity Theater Project) and *Clybourne Park* (Kevin/Albert, Circle Players). Directing credits include *My Dead Boyfriend Is A Robot* (Oberlin College), *Night Into Morning* (Short Film) and *Detroit '67* (Assistant Director, Karamu House). Preston is a past fellow for the Tennessee Playwrights Studio (2019). Preston was also named a semi-finalist playwright for both the 2023 Del Shore Writers Search (*BOCKING*) and the 2022 Obsidian Theater Festival (*BOCKING*). Preston holds a Playwriting MFA degree from The New School of Drama and a BFA degree from Oberlin College, where they currently serve as a visiting Professor of Theater and Africana Studies.



GYM playwrights are area professionals who are given various resources to help further their work, including rehearsal space, collaboration with a director to assist the playwright, marketing and public events supported by the theatre. The GYM's goal is to nurture new work in a safe environment.

## THE GYM HAS TWO PARTS

Full-length Readings: lightly staged readings of full plays are conducted in the theatre or in Dobama's 2nd Floor Arts Space. These are scheduled throughout the season.

**GYM Shorts:** a showcase of new short works or excerpts from full-length plays by GYM playwrights are read in an annual event usually in January or February.

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



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












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
