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
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
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FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR



Climate change is no joke. The devastating effects of drought and flood, fires and storms, threaten human lives now and in the future. It's an epic problem that receives an epic treatment in Madeleine

George's new play *Hurricane Diane*, which uses the Greek tragedy *The Bacchae* as its foundation to shine a light on this all-important issue. But how to make us listen? American culture is built on consumerism and commercialism - on comfort and convenience with little thought to waste, sustainability, and the future of the planet. Brilliantly, the playwright uses other aspects of American culture, such as personalities we recognize from reality television and the snappy dialogue of sitcoms, as the second pillar on which she builds her adaptation.

This brilliant script, brought to life by a superlative cast, is one of those special plays that elicits hearty laughs, audible gasps, and thought-provoking conversation. Laughter puts the audience at ease and makes the experience wildly enjoyable, so that we let our guard down just long enough to be thrilled with dark surprises around each corner. In Madeleine George's remarkable tragi-comedy *Hurricane Diane*, climate change is hilarious... until it's not. As Diane says early in the play, "Nervous? Don't be. It's going to be okay. It's

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going to feel amazing to save the world."

Thank you for being a part of this brilliant production - the next in Dobama's 2021/22 Re-opening Season. We remain immensely grateful for your support and recognize the numerous obstacles you overcome to join us for live theatre at this moment in time. Rooming House of Mme. Lemonde (Target Margin) and Jason Grote's A Christmas Carol (The Brick).



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
ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT



MADELEINE GEORGE's plays include Hurricane Diane (Obie Award), The (curious case of the) Watson Intelligence (Pulitzer Prize finalist; Outer Critics Circle John Gassner Award), Seven Homeless Mammoths Wander New England (Susan Smith Blackburn finalist), Precious Little, and The Zero Hour (Jane Chambers Award, Lambda Literary Award finalist). Honors include a Whiting Award, the Princess Grace Award, and a Lilly Award. Madeleine's translation of Chekhov's Three Sisters is set to premiere at Two River Theater in 2022, and her audio adaptation of Alison Bechdel's comic strip Dykes to Watch Out For is forthcoming from Audible Originals. Madeleine is a founding

member of the Obie-Award-winning playwrights' collective 13P (www.13p.org), the Mellon Playwright in Residence at Two River Theater, and a writer on the Hulu mystery-comedy "Only Murders in the Building". Since 2006, she has worked with the Bard Prison Initiative at Bard College, where she currently serves as Director of Admissions.



KIRSTEN NICOLE (KIX)




COLIN ANDERSON

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
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
