FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR



Our late twenties can be a difficult and confusing time of transition. At that age, we are firmly in adulthood but often don't feel all that grown-up. Perhaps most unsettlingly, for the first time in

our lives, there is not the built-in social circle that a school environment provides. We're now working in intergenerational environments while friends begin to move away, get married, have children, start families, or pursue diverse new interests and opportunities. It can be an uncertain and lonely time in our lives.

Due to stigma and discrimination, gav. bisexual, and other men who have sex with men carry a heightened burden of loneliness. According to a study by the National Institute of Health, 61% of gay men surveyed reported experiencing loneliness which resulted in episodes of depression and/or anxiety. Gay men are twice as likely to have a major depressive episode and are reported to have fewer close friends than straight people or gay women. Travis Salway, a researcher with the BC Centre for Disease Control in Vancouver, spent over five years studying suicide by gay men. "The defining feature of gay men used to be the loneliness of the closet," he said. "But now you've got millions of gay men who have come out of the closet and they still feel the same isolation."

In Joshua Harmon's fantastic new play SIGNIFICANT OTHER, Jordan is struggling to navigate this time of transition in his life, made more difficult as a gay man. He is looking for love and care while grieving the lost connections to his inner circle who have been a source of support to him in the past. As his closest friends, who all happen to be straight women, find love and get married one-by-one, Jordan's longing for connection overwhelms him.

All relationships evolve and change. People come and go as they play different roles in our lives. That is often a challenging thing to accept. For Jordan, his desperate need to have someone he can love and trust at this moment in his life is something we all can relate to as we root for him to find comfort and companionship.

This funny, beautiful, and heartfelt play closes our 23/24 season, fulfilling the theme of Family Found. We hope you are as excited as we are about our newly announced line-up of shows for next year and we look forward to welcoming you back to the theatre for another season of incredible productions. As always, thank you for your support of live, professional theatre, and for being a vital part of the Dobama family.



The GYM's goal is to nurture new work in a safe environment.

THE GYM HAS TWO PARTS

Full-length Readings: lightly staged readings of full plays are conducted in the theatre or in Dobama's 2nd Floor Arts Space. These are scheduled throughout the season.

GYM Shorts: a showcase of new short works or excerpts from full-length plays by GYM playwrights are read in an annual event usually in January or February.






